STOP TORNNESS



A Walk for Life will take place between Faslane nuclear submarine base and Greenham Common from May to August, passing several major nuclear installations on its way. To celebrate the arrival of the walkers at Torness nuclear power station, there will be a festival at Barns Ness near Torness. A whole Bank Holiday of celebration — music, theatre, videos, creche, events and lots, lots more.

Enjoy your bank holiday at Torness and make your contribution to peace.

NO NUKES

The Walk for Life will stop here to bring home to people the links between nuclear power and nuclear weapons. If built, Torness would emit dangerous low-level radiation to the surrounding area. It would produce deadly waste which would be dangerous for thousands of years — and there is no safe method of disposal! The waste would then be transported by rail (along the same route as the walk) to Windscale.

Plutonium is separated from the waste, there. This is the fuel for nuclear bombs. Torness would produce about 5 tonnes of plutonium — enough to make between 200 and 500 nuclear bombs. Because of its important functions as energy and weapons producer, it would be a prime target in the event of nuclear war.

No disarmament will be effective without the dismantling of nuclear power stations.

CAMPING

Campsite accommodation is available at Barns Ness next to the Festival site from Fri. 27th May to Wed. 1st June at £1 per person. Over the weekend, leading to the festival a "Green Gathering" will be held, so bring your own instruments, costumes, and help create a real

festival atmosphere.

TRANSPORT

SCRAM are organising buses from Edinburgh on 30th May. There will be 2 waves of buses leaving Waverley Bridge. The first wave will leave at 10.00 am to join the Walk for Life from Dunbar to Barns Ness. The second wave will leave 12 noon and go direct to the festival. Tickets from SCRAM. A cycle ride for a Nuclear free and safe energy future will leave Waverley Bridge at 9.00 am.

HELP
