I'VE BEEN LIVING for a month in a quiet field outside Glastombury, my spiritual home, the heart; a welcome and (for me) a mecessary contrast to Molesworth as it's been since the military invasion of February 5th. Since I've been away the Ræmbiw Villagers have been forced to move om agaim twice, three times, and Phoebe Stomechild - Sid & Jules' daughter - has beem borm. The latest issue of the 'Molesworth Bulletim' has arrived - the mewsletter which was first printed and published at the Raimbow Village - to provide am urgent warning that the military mind and the forces of the state are becoming more reactive and oppressive all the time.

The best hope, as far as I can see, is that if it took all those soldiers and all those policemen and 3 months planming to deal with just over 100 cf us, then how will the government ever mamage to cope if thousands start living the way we did at Rainbow Fields ? But it's mot a subject which I which to dwell om now. Spring is here again and summer follows soom. It's time to be om the move agaim but in a gentler fashion.

A year ago I did an I Ching reading for the first Collective Mailing. I interpreted the reading to mean we should "build up our emergies and resources, and develop the Collective on a personal level ... our activities should be focussed on what we can do to make ourselves waseful, to comtribute to the green/peace/alternative movement as a whole, rather than on how we can promote the Green Collective for its own sake"; and that if we can build our plans in a gradual, controlled way, "them 1985 could be our year for more spectacular results".

Let's all wish ourselves luck. I'll start with another I Ching reading ...

"Strange lands and separation are the wanderer's lot" ... but perseverance brings good fortune.

A wanderer and stränger ... should not give himself airs. He must be cautious and reserved. If he is obliging towards others, he wims success. A wanderer has no fixed abode; his home is on the road ... " which seems pretty clear, whether we be with the Green Roadshow or traveling on our own account. The Image is of 'Fire on the Mountain':

"When grass on the macuntain takes fire, there is bright light. However, the fire does not linger in one place, but travels on to new fuel ... " which puts me in mind of Raimbow Fields. But the changeing limes suggest an end to all this wandering:

"The wanderer comes to an imm. He has his property with him"; and them "He shoots a pheasant. It drops with the first arrow ... " which isn't a very vegetarian image, but that's because it comes from ancient China where "Traveling statesmen were in the habit of introducing themselves to local princes with the gift of a pheasant". The commentary goes on: "Circumstances oftem cause a man to seek a home in foreign parts. If he knows how to meet the situation and how to introduce himself in the right way, he may find a circle of friends and a sphere of activity even im a strange country".

Since the summer before last the Collctive has had no 'home'; no Gathering site nor regular meeting place. Over the winter some of us were at Raimbow Fields, Molesworth; but there the 'local primee' certainly didm't want to us to stay around. On a personal level I find that myself and many of my friends are leaving our homes, moving on, with no fixed place to go. The way I read the I Ching, if we kee going, if we do our best with what we find om the way, then we may land up im places we never expected to be; but "in the end this brings both praise a nd office".

But as usual with the I Ching, there's a reminder not to take it all for granted. The second reading offers a warning, linked with the fifth month of the Chinese year (June-July) when "the principle of darkmess, after having been eliminated, furtively and unexpectedly obtrudes again from within and below"; a seductive situation, the premature and incomplete appearance of what only seems to be what we're seeking.

But if we keep our heads together, then om another level things will be working well. "When heaven and earth come to meet each other, all creatures prosper ... But the coming together must be free of dishonest ulterior motives otherwise harm will result".

"Heaven is far from the things of the earth, but it sets them im motion by means of the wind ... " Let's go with the wimd for mow, and see where we all arrive.

Glastonbury Green Field: The advance publicity for this year's CND festival calls the Green Field 'one of the greatest successes of last year's festival". The budget has been doubled as compated to last year, on top of which exhibitions from Greenpeace and the National Centre for Alternative Technology have been booked independently. Last year we weren't even mentiomed on the leaflets, so we must have achieved something !

Not yet clear whether we shall be in Norman's Close again, or in a new field. Plan is to keep vehicles off completely this year, so we may be next to the space reserved for living vand. Full details in mext month's mailing.

There will be reduced fees for stall holders in the Green Field, and free tickets and possible other frimge benefits for people working and comtributing to the field - but the crew has to be arranged in advance, so get in touch now if you're interested. If you're thinking of just turning up for the 3-day event itself, note thatbthis year it will be <u>advance ticket-holders only</u> tickets available from CND, 11 Goodwir St, London N4 3HQ, £16.

Miltom Keynes Green Gathering: The Milton Keynes Greentown Group seem to be approaching the climax of their negotiations with the Miltom Keynes Development Corporation, after six years of bureaucratic hassle. The land im question is currently under cultivation; by harvest (possible time for a Gathering) the Greentowners will either have possession or be locked in conflict with MKDC. The Greentowners are basically im favour of holding a limited-duratiom Gathering on their site, but feel, it could be politically unsound for them to organise it; carry om Collective ! Alternative sites (Buddhist Peace Pagoda, unused building land from MKDC) are also being looked imto.

The mext meeting to discuss the Gathering will be held at the Raimbow Housing Co-Op, Spencer Street, New Bradwell, iltin Keynes on April 13/14. This will probably reach you too late for that imformation to be any use; but im the meant time details from David Taylor, 4 Bridge House, St Ives, Huntingdom, Cambs (0480 63054). Clearer picture of what's going down im the mext Mailing.

Green Collective Land Fund: this currently still contains less than £200; but we've been contacted by at least two other groups with land funds of their own who may be interested in limking up if a suitable project loons on the misty horizon. These are the Llandeilo Green Group and, more spectacularly, Cartwheel, who wheeled themselves all around the country two or three years ago collecting donations specially to set up an alternative community. So potentially the fund could be worth mearly £2000 by now, and still growing.

(PTO

(Band Fund ...) Several people from the Cartwheel Project are now involved with the Collective, and they see our aims as so similar that we'd do best to limk up together. This will be discussed at the Milton Keynes Gathering at the meeting on April 13/14. In the mean time they're writing to everyone om their mailing list suggesting that they subscribe to the Collective. We should have an article explaining exactly what Cartwheel is about, in time for the mext mailing.

David now has a specimem <u>Trust Deed</u> drafted for the Land Fund, which meeds looking into in detail. Anyone with the right kind of brain should contact David at Bridge House.

SO MANY THINGS GOING ON ! One thing that struck me very strongly at the last Collective meeting was how many different projects and organisations, between us, we're into. There's still a great long list of stuff ...

<u>Sunflowers</u>: Ann Gunn (8 Wordsworth Road, Braimtree, Essex) is still holding the stock, but extra energy is required for selling all the goodies. We could arrange for anyone who's often involved in stalls etc to hold local stocks. <u>Green Collective Postcards</u> are now available from Simflowers @ 20p each or 12p in bulk. Can anyone fijd local shops to stock the cards ? There's still a possibility of a tie-up with <u>Ecotrade</u> as long as we have a say in the presentation of the cabalogues etc; but the Ecology Party dom't seem to be making a lot of progress in getting this one together.

dreembase Computer is complete at Bridge House and ready to use; available for mailing lists atc. Charges: cost of sticky Tabels plus £5 to help build Greembase funds. Mitra from the London Resource Group is eagre to link our machine into his metworking activity. Richard Oldfield is gradually building up a green data base, so it should soon be able to print out information at the touch of a button instead of the cutrent situation where everything has to be typed up, crossed out, ammended, and photocopied im a state of disrepair. Contact Richard at Bridge House.

Green Congress ... The idea's still alive, waiting for someone with the right ve nue and the mecessary emergy to get it together ... this wimter ?

<u>Collective pamphlet</u> ... Richard reports that his draft is now 95% complete, but ... the computer has swallowed the text. If not retrievable he will have a new draft ready for the mext meeting.

A London Gathering/Event: Following the offer of a site last year (by the GLC to the Roadshow) Richie and Poppy are making enquirers re a City Gathering or in the year. GLC have no large parks available, but could offer a small one; though this would involve filling in a lot of forms, taking out imsurances etc etc. Possible link-up withn<u>Greem Deserts</u>, who are also looking for a site im Das Kapital.

International Green Gathering at Molesworth ? Serious problems with the landowner; but CND are now considering an event of their own in the late summer. We'll be keeping int touch with them and 'Wheat to the Starving' to see if we can make any input. The idea of a Targe-scale International Greem Gathering is another one which is still alive and looking for a home. Looking back over past Mailings, I see that this time Tast year we were talking about a <u>Greem</u> Earth Gathering, which now seems to be happening at Milton Keynes.

Festival Welfare Services: I've just had a letter from Richie saying "I've writtem to FWS Penny who asked whether the Green Collective would like to be one of its member organisations and if I would like to be a mamed Trustee ... I said ges we would though I kmow that it is not strictly good policy to take decisions individually for the Collective ... So, if you could make a note of that somewhere in the Mailing under FWS". Note duly made.

Also a message to say "FWS will not be getting a grant from the Jubilee "hast for Stomehenge this year, so I don't know what we will be able to do for the kids there. We are making enquiries about someone to run a lost kids' temt, but I've been told that the Green Roadshow are organising a children's area at Stonehenge. Is this right ? - 'cos if so, perhaps we can contribute im some way."

In fact the Roadshow is already committed to the Glastonbury Green Field over midsummer, but Richie's getting in touch to say we may well be imterested next year.

On the subject of <u>Stonehenge</u> in general, FWS report that "Nothing further has been heard from the National Trust regarding their earlier intentions to stop the festival. In the local paper there's a report that the District Council are setting aside £5000 to clear rubbish after the festival, so it looks at this stage as if the event will go ahead ..." NG: See late news at the bottom of Festival List.

Also happening on Salisbury Plaim this summer is a women's march from Avebury to Stomehenge (April 30th to May 3rd) involving 'Reclaim the Plaim' actions and trespass on miltary lands, leading to intensive activities by the 'Cruise watch' metwork right through the month of May. CND will be supporting a similar scheme through July, which will involve local CND groups being om 'red alert' ready to come and join the melee if any cruise convoys are sighted, With Stomehenge festival in between, it looks like it's going to be an interesting summer on the Plain this year.

OR ... HOW TO GROW A FAMILY IN UNDER TWO YEARS - STATE OF THE ART

After th Green Field meeting on Saturday, Sunday's Roadshow meeting had already got a sense of solid direction seeing the possibility of once more getting a lot of our equipment and resources together through the experimes we receive from working there, which we can then take away with us on the road. There were however a lot of people in the meeting who had not met before and so we began with a "go round" in which each person tried to say what they had, what they wanted to do, why they wanted to do it and if there was anything they meeded to know. It was very useful but quite difficult because no-ome wanted to miss any of it but there were 12 kids with us 17 adults which could get pretty distracting. I use my notes from that as the basis for this report, it'll tell you who's who and what they do, it'll be patchy and maybe longwinded but if you'll bear with me I think you'll find it ultimately informative as to the state of the Roadshow. It's the way we had to find out so here goes for you:

NOTABLY ABSENT:

Toe, Eddie and Steve, who had arrived on Saturday from Derby and decided overnight that the Roadshow was not the thing for them to do a cafe as part of, yet? Pete and Penny Simmons, who are in touch and getting their mobile cinema together.

Jenkings and his Amimal Rights bus; will be always be too busy 7 Martim phoned up on Sunday apologising for getting arrested leaving from the Raimbow Village to come down here. He wants to use his bus to transport people and equipment at the same time as researching lamd which had been offered to Cartwheel as potential community sites, and which may now be of real use to the Travelers, Peace Movement and Greens alike.

Terry also phoned up having been arrested too. He's found another bus and wamts to do the cafe again with a couple of friends and our help, even after last year's experiences of so many changes and disasters. (There are still other groups interested in doing our maybe cafe including Happytimes Lin and some of the old Munchies & Slurpies crew).

CHRIS and Woo, who will be working together again this year with Annie on their Theatre and Puppet Shows, but not as integral Roadshow stuff. Last year was very comfusing for the larger group that they were with, not knowing whether to be part of the Roadshow or not. They want to get om on their own but will as ever be into joiming in wherever there is the space at the same events (we can be a focus for a lot of people's emergies towards kids).

<u>Penmy. Bendi and Jess after a short winter in Tibet are back in Devon and expecting another baby in June which makes it very difficult for them to be able b commit themselves to anything more, though they'll certainly be around and into it where they can. Last year they were the early core and focus of the Roadshow and I'm very sad that they can't be with us more completely doing their Kids' Arts and Whacky Theatre.</u>

<u>Celia. Mary and Circe</u> were with the Roadshow in the later part of the season last year doing art and theatre stuff, now they're in Portugal with Tibet still. Themlines between the Anarchists' Syndicalism, The Roadshow, me as a Bureaucrat the new Green Deserts organising group and the traveling community are weaving delicate patterns in my mind. <u>Naomi and Stan</u> of ^Brer Rabbit fame, who rarely get out of Wales, worked with

Fram, Dave and Luke have a brand new baby boy, Jacob, born on March 18th im their caravan at Waterleat. All is well and we can expect to see them at the Green Field with some workshops for the kids. Last year they traveled over the early part of the tour with bakery workshops and Dave was the only member of Planetwaves apart from myself who stuck with the Roadshow even for a while. Eirwen and Jaki, who have independently both made offers of help on the traveling Skool idea. We'll have some 12 or so kids of our own to learn with, so though there may not be a traveling Skool Bus as I had hoped (this year) they may still be interested in working in with us where they can.

(Roadshow meeting Volume Two): PRESENT

Simon, Val and their children will travel, in their beautiful Skyboat Bedford Truck. He is a working artist and she is into massage. They want to be im a community situation with their kids and to work on the kids' things at the fostivals with us. There was a meat connection to a free trailer which we may be able to pick up from London. It's a 12' x 6' heavy thing that folds out into a 12' x 12' stage. It needs some work and Simon is getting ideas together for building a convertable play structure onto it (insurance angles are being imvestigated). He may also apply to ICI for a paint grant to paint all the yehicles ("Paint your Wagom !") Sandy has a truck, a beautiful voice (singing with a band called Solstice)

<u>Sandy</u> has a truck, a beautiful voice (singing with a band called Solstice) and is expecting a baby very soom. It was her first encounter with the Roadshow so she wanted to listen; she is keen to get music together and come down with Simon and Val and ...

Danmy, Guler and their childrem. They are into building a real family alternative and working in with the Roadshow where it is needed. He is especially into children's games and stories and music with others, she with getting theatre and children's workshops together with all of us. They will travel im their Ford Motor Caravan and will toww a caravan which they offer to ... Poppy and her son Julian, who want to travel and work in with the supportive group with work on active peaceful conflict resulution. She wan's to put across the non-authoritarian/Green idea through drama improvisation, puppets for childrem to link the ideas developing out of Interhelp, Peace Child towards children's own expression of their feelings and ideas on the future. Many many ideas for exciting projects involving symbolic themes.

Mark and his childrem want to work in on the kids' projects. He has a lot of engineering and building experience and will help Steve and Bobby with the AT on the Green Field and Simon with the design and construction of the climbing structure. He has a Bedford Duple Coach and the childrens' mother Francesca a homeopath and close friend may or may not come too.

<u>Steve</u> was at many of the same events towards the end of last year with his green Leyland converted ambulance (FG), windmill generator, matching awning, displays info and literature which he is going to extend with funding from the Green Field. The display will be weather-proof and portable/adaptable, covering the connections between power, ecology, the nuclear chain and the application of the appropriate technology which he also demonstrates and markets. He wants to do more village green events and cover traction engine rallies and farm fairs <u>Amme</u> has done info and book stall events for years, and as part of the Roadshow last year. This year it will be from a transit van, and she often works with <u>Demis</u>, a Riff Raff poet, performing as he gives out his free leaflets and reaches out to new people - at Molesworth a lot recently with his own anarchic poetic lumacy.

Bec, Nonny and Tom will be working with Simon (who is due back from Spain soom) on the wholefood and smacks stall. Bec hopes to get a bigger vehicle than the Morris van she has at present in order to be anle to transport ...

Loppy, Sam and Sarah after the school term is over at the end of July. She is a bit unsure of what she has to offer but her experience in peace work/walks and her screen printing, with the love we have for them, are more than enough to start with. Between XXX them are three tame rats.

<u>Mijke and Toby</u> are feeling much stronger and still committed after the learning from the lessons of last year's disasters, when she took on the cafe when the Peters dropped out just before Glastonbury. She hopes to exchange her Tranny for a BR crew cab vehicle to transport her tipi which she wants to use for small displays and a quiet workshop space. It is important for her to spend time with Toby and grow together with the kids on the road.

Dave Jones, new to the group, is a very experienced play worker and finds the idea of traveling the festivals with this inspiring and flexible group very attractive. He has a bicycle, and is into working in the creche and children's activities with songs, games, theatre, and lots of fun.

Bruce, who does this mailing and has lots of experience im journalism and site management is into getting a Morris pick-up together and taking a structure around to do information on sites as a mobile print shop. He may even be able to carry me (mot if I have to do all your typing mate my fingers are dropping off) as well as joining in doing things even perhaps the kids' bakery workshops.

(Roadshow meeting episode three)

And me. Richie; I've been organising this thing for two years now, trying to keep a sense of its shape and get a tour together for it. I've been writing, talking and thinking about it all, getting the family together on the road, battling with the realities of the thing - the festivals, travelers, Convoy, New Age Gipsies, Tibet, and trying to patch in an understanding of the Roadshow's relationship to all that ... as well as my own ...

I'm aware that there is a family feel emerging which is very different to the family of experienced earthed travelers who made up last year's core; it is more like idealism and search and I find myself treading the middle ground between the Gre en Roadshow and the Travelers, I'm awate that my family and kim are not going to be with the Roadshow though they may be at many of the events that we do and are free to work in with us (we can act as a focus for the emergies of many people at festivals who want to work with kids). After this season though I shall be committing myself to my real family who are mostly im Pevon (especially my son and his Mum and her new husband and beautiful baby). We are strting a pilot scheme for a potential free learning centre for deschooled kids in the rea, in a barn on a beautiful farm in the middle of it all. It's what I personally want to do to work with those kids, even full time, with my real family; maybe we can get it all on the road next year. Certainly I want to work with the kids at Stoneherge and hopefully with independent transport we can go wherever we choose. I've been working towards this for about 6 years. I may be into festival organisation, and what I see as am emerging festival resource group. I may personally travel less with the Roadshow this year, but these are just feelings I'm voiving ... on the road ... TO A PEACEFUL FUTURE ... AT HOME ... ROOTS.

THE EMERGING TOUR

At Harewarren in May we will assemble as a morem or less complete Roadshow froup with most of the gear and have a trial run, finish the climbing structure, fix the marquee up, see what we've got and find out what we meed. Them we will be ready to move as a group onto the site early at <u>Long Marston</u>, <u>Fairs Against</u> <u>Famine</u>, a new Green Deserts fairs organising group; they're asking the travelers fair people and performers to work together for no more than expenses. Then if it is a success the lion's share of the profits will go to the work of Green <u>P</u>eserts in North Africa towards the permanent relief of starvation. We will mearly all go there [I think that means Long Marston, not North Africa - Ed) as some 26 adults and 15 kids in 13 vehicles. As the first event of the year it will be a place where the travelers all say hello and it's very magical and many important links are made here. We could well go there early and be responsible for facussing the children's area there. We may take a one day run to <u>Strawberry Fair</u> (Cambridge); certainly Marijke and Denis will be coming

From there all the projects like theatre and music can only grow as we're together more. We can move into the <u>Seen Field</u> around June 10th and begin the work of setting up the AT displays, creche and children's workshops. We're almost certainly booked for a minimum of £125 at the <u>Leamington Festival</u>, for a small kids' set-up in the marquee - maybe travel in one or two vehicles to do it.

Beverley Rainbow CND thing can't afford us but they are getting it together to have a creche, kids' ents, wholefoods etc anyway; so the idea that events dom't meed us, that they should really get t here things together from their local community ... decentralised ... encouraging !

The festival list (next page) is marked with a * by the events which we are or are likely to go to. I will write a breakdown of the events for the mext mailing as there is a lot of enlightening information behind many of these dates.

For now ... Brung all your spare wooden bricks, toys, wood, marquee side poles, carpets, rope, costumes, paint and brushes to Harewarren and we'll put them to good use in the Green Roadshow.

Thanks to Bec for putting up with all of us in her house again, and to Pete and Susie for cooking us Sunday lunch. Hi Ho we Come and we Go.

Should the 'Green Collective' become the 'Green Network'?

One regular feature of Collective meetings over the last couple of years has been an item we usually refer to as 'Collective Perspective'. This is a time when we drop discussing any particular project and share our thoughts and feelings on the direction the Collective is taking. I hope we can use this article as a discussion paper for our next 'Collective Perspective' discussion -perhaps at Harewarren.

I love the word 'Collective'.We've been using it since the beginning and I've always felt that it described our informal, close and anarchic way of working rather well.The problem is that it implies that we are one group.The last two years have seen us grow from one group to roughly five, one for each of the principle project areas. In addition we now have some two hundred subscribers to the mailing and dozens of local green groups and collectives, all part of the wider informal network that is already growing.

Could each of the different project groups become more like lectives in their own right. The term 'network' describes more accurately what we are becoming and will also help facilitate contact between local green groups. They can all feel together as part of a 'network'. Can they all feel part of a 'Collective'?

The proposal, at the moment, is this :-

I) We agree, at Harewarren, to start moving towards a 'network' identity and drop the word 'collective'.Given our existing stocks of letter headings and leaflets this will be a gradual process. In the intervening period we can no doubt think of ourselves as the 'Green Collective Network'.

2) We approach local green groups/collectives and see if they would like to join.I don't see any need for a financial qualification at the moment, just an indication of support so that we can build up a directory of interested groups.

3) We convinue encouraging autonomy within existing Collective projects.Changing to a 'network'would help maintain that momentum.The increasing numbers of people coming in contact with the projects through the network can only help.

4) At some stage, perhaps in the autumn, we formally launch the Green Network at a large gathering/meeting. It might be fitting for us to do this in Glastonbury.

Additional factors :-

*GreenBase will clearly have an important role in facilitating the exchange of information around the Collective/Network; linking in, where we feel it neccessary, with other networks.

*Green Line has already expressed an interest in joining such a network and allowing us a regular one or two pages to exchange up to date information of projects and local group activities.

*When the 'Green Gathering Collective' first became the 'Green Collective' we agreed to hold regular mini-gatherings/large meetings for all our friends and everyone involved in the different projects. The idea was to deal with most of the business separately in the specific project groups and leave these mini-gatherings for healing and celebration as well as sharing ideas and plans. The Harewarren Thering/meeting is the first of these. With the emergence of a 'N etwork' I hope these gatherings will gradually come to replace the old-style Collective meetings. *If Green Line is going to be passing network information on every month what should happen to the Collective mailing? My feeling is that Green Line will never be able to adequately report on the projects and groups, there simply wouldn't be space. The Collective mailing also has its own feeling; to lose it would be tragic. What about bringing out the mailing four times a year, between the mini-gatherings, and developing it as the Network mailing with, hopefully, an ever-growing circulation?

* It's very important that we project the 'Network' as being independent of any political parties.I'd therefore like to suggest that to start with we only involve independent green groups and projects.After the 'launch' we might feel like welcoming in any group that subscribes to a basic set of green principles whatever their partypolitical affiliation.This could also include community associations, pressure groups and local trade which branches.

A Network such as this, with the Roadshow, the Advice Pack, Sunflowers, Gatherings and Green Line, would undoubtably help facilitate the grwath of local green groups.

I'm aware that I'm not talking of anything particularly new.I feel more as if I'm pointing to a process which is already underway.I hope it helps to look closely and consciously at what we are doing,to constantly review our own working processes with an eye to searching out new directions and breaking new ground (do you realise what a horrible landist (1) phrase that is?).Anyway,no doubt we'll all discuss this at Harewarren.If anybody who isn't coming wants to throw in a few thoughts please write to me.

WHY AM I HERE ? by Rainbow Jo

What is Molesworth to me ? Why am I still here, still returning after mearly three years ? Surely I have done my bit by mow - what is the hold this place has on me ?

Molesworth changed my life. I came to live at the peace camp in the early days, quite by accident. In had been involved in a Student CND group, had visited Greenham, and decided to visit Molesworth for a few days 'holiday' after my exams. I was at a crossroads in my life, unsure what to do mext, and what I found at the peace camp then awoke my exhausted and battered spirit. It was a new vision, a new way to live, a new reason to live. We all felt it then, this inspiration; peace not protest, creation not fear.

We lost it of course. Collectively, individually, the vision faded into personal disagreements, disappointments; the dream faded as dreams do. But I was set on a course of peace camps, traveling, festivals, alternative living - at Molesworth several strands of my life all came together, a raimbow rope to balance on safely. Afterwards, I never had the same certainty that what I was doing was right and true; my ideals were crushed by reality, other people, cold _nd mud and bread-lime illegal living.

And then, quite by accident again, I returned to Molesworth for the Green Gathering in August last year and my truck would go no further. It seemed like a good place to stay for the winter - water on tap, friends around me, this growing community which came to be the Raimbow Fields Village. This was something different, this was the best place and even diwedtado found myself dragged back into the peace movement (had I ever left ?), I conceived a child, I started to believe again.

I was away when they evicted us. It wasn't real to me until I'd gome throug the police roadblocks, right up to the barbed wire and the arc lights and the soldiers at their braziers, walked along Peace Lame and seen it all - and then I felt it. Even going there now, a month later, even thinking of it makes me want to cry. To the authorithes and the milibary, Molesworth airfield is a place on a map. To those of us who have been touched by its spirit, it is a place in the heart which will not go away. We will not go away:

Rainbow Village is still together and getting stronger. To some friends here, the Village and what it stands for is more important than Molesworth the place. To other friends, returning to Molesworth is paramount, with or without the Village. I don't know what to do myself, but I do know that the thousands of people who will go there now arrive to protest at the construction of a cruise missile base - but many of them will go home (or remain) with something new. Rainbow Village at its best is part of the vision, an unfolding many seeds taking root and growing. And the spirit of Moksworth continues despite the physical reality - we can see the fences and the soldiers, but at the same time we can see the earth and the sky, the light im all life and the rainbow bridge. I hope you see it too, and I hope you feel it.
