INFORMATION

This year's jamboree will be held at Keele University on September 7th, 8th and 9th - all members are encouraged to attend.

Travel equalisation scheme: despite the lack of interest last year, we will again be attempting to organize such a scheme. Members interested in claiming part of their travel expenses should contact David Taylor.

Camping site: The Trentham Gardens site is about five miles from the University. Members who wish to use the site should book in early - ring 0782 657225.

Creche: If there is sufficient demand, Biff Vernon will be co-ordinating a creche rota. If you will be bringing your children to the conference and would be prepared to take a turn supervising the creche, please phone Biff on 01 658 4086.

Conference papers: These will be sent out three weeks in advance. Copies will also be sent to all branch secretaries.

Voting: The NEC has decided that 4 members of next year's NEC will be elected by postal ballot, and two will be elected at the conference. (See NEC Report in Econews 3). If you wish to stand for one of these six seats on the NEC, please send your name and address to David Taylor. This should reach him by August 1st to be included on the postal ballot. Candidates should also send him a 150 word manifesto about themselves.

Food: The meals provided at the University will almost certainly be institution junk food, and for the carnivorous only. They are also very expensive. Many members prefer to take their own food, a course of action recommended by the Editor. The high cost of the weekend can also be reduced by booking one room for several people, and bringing sleeping bags.
